Fine. Put me down for then. Thanks. (drops everything.) (to Herself) Jesus Christ, I can't even make a doctor's appointment in the same month anymore.

D: (Stares as she fumbles with all her stuff)

K: (looks up) Sorry I didn't realize you were here. Am I supposed to be on that side?

D: It doesn't really matter. I can go over there, since you have all that stuff...

K: Oh, no. It's no problem (she gathers up her stuff leaving behind a tampon and proceeds to cross the street)

K: (settling in) First day.

D: I know.

K: Marcy

D: Kevin

K: Nice to meet you. So I'm just supposed to stand here right?

D: yep.

K: That's it?

D: Yep. Simple.

K: (Puts on Lipstick)

D: (Gives the "What are you doing" Look).

K: I look horrible without makeup.

D: (Rolls eyes)

K: (Does Downward Dog . . . Sees D between her legs). It's yoga.

(Phone rings 3-4 times "We built this City on Rock and Roll")

K: (Rummages through her purse, but misses the call)

(K takes sip of water)
(Waiting . . . K waves at cars)

D: You don't have to wave.

- K: I know, I thought it might make a stronger impression.
- D: Now it looks like I should be waving. I'm not going to wave.

(Waiting . . . D looks up)

- D: I should have worn a hat.
- K: Oh . . . I don't think I brought sunscreen.
- D: Sunscreen is like rule number one.
- K: (Rummaging through purse). I took out some stuff this morning, credit cards, and pens, because I wasn't sure I had a place to put my bag. Do you have any?
- D: Yeah . . . in my car.
- K: Can I borrow some? I hate to be a pest.
- D: I guess I can get you some . . . on break.
- K: I don't want you to use your break to get sunscreen.
- D: It's no biggie . . . it's not like there's anywhere to actually go on break. The alley behind the DQ has a picnic table, but it's kind of sketchy. You can sit here on the curb, but that sort defeats the purpose of having a break
- K: Yeah, I'd want to go someplace else for a break. Are you sure about the sunscreen?
- D: Yeah. Sometimes I take my break in the car anyway.

(engine revs and peels out)

- K: Did you see that Corvette? What a jerk.
- D: That was a nice car. I love corvettes?
- K: My boyfriend had one in high-school.
- D: What year?
- K: Junior I think.
- D: No the year of the car.
- K: I don't know . . . I don't really pay attention to those things
- D: I'm a big fan the 1963 Roadster.
- K: Yeah, I wouldn't know.

(Waiting)

K: (Finishing her water) Can I just go to the bathroom when I need to?

D: Yeah, if you use your break. We get fifteen minutes before lunch.

K: When's lunch?

D: 2:00.

K: 2:00?

D: They want us out here during the lunch rush.

K: You're kidding me. What time is it now?

D: We just got here. Rule number two is ration your liquids. Did you drink that whole thing?

K: Yeah, I'm trying to keep hydrated.

D: The trick is to nurse it throughout the day. If you drink it all at once you'll have a mid-morning whiz-fest.

K: Okay. Well I'm going to take my break now. I'll be right back.

(K leaves . . . D Waits, inspects tampon. . . K Comes back)

K: Whoo. I just had a coffee.

D: At the Starbucks?

K: Yeah, I had to buy something . . . to use the bathroom. I usually don't drink coffee, but wow!!! I got a tiny espresso, so I won't have to pee all day.

D: I usually use the Best Buy.

K: Do they make you buy something?

D: Nope.

K: Shoot. You didn't tell me that.

D: I didn't know you needed to know.

(K starts waving and shuffling her feet)

K: Whoo! This caffeine stuff is great. I can't believe I don't drink it more often. Wow I feel pretty awesome. This day is going to fly by. (pause until the excitement dies a little) So how did you get this job?

D: Well, I was a mover. Driving the big trucks. I was moving a family from Cincinnati to here, and well, this is where I ended up. I've been here for six months and I've had this job for about four.
