PHILLIP

Alright, fine. But I'm not going to spend all day video chatting with you. I've got things to do.

MOM

You? What do you have to do?

PHILLIP

Things. Never you mind. (Looks around room) OK, what's next?

MOM

Well, there's that box over there. That's your stuff, isn't it?

PHILLIP

Hey, my tap shoes!

MOM

Junk pile.

PHILLIP

What? You're crazy. Those are my tap shoes!

MOM

PHILLIP

PHILLIP

MOM

MOM

MOM

PHILLIP

MOM

PHILLIP

MOM

MOM
